Foundation board elections 2025

Are you interested in occupational retirement provision and the work that goes into it? Then seize the opportunity and run as a candidate for the foundation board of the Vita Collective Foundation. New members will be elected in the spring of 2025.

What can you expect as a member of the foundation board?

As the highest body of the foundation, the foundation board decides on the overall direction and is responsible for the leadership of the foundation. The foundation board members determine the strategic goals and principles of the pension plan and make decisions about the measures to be taken. They also define how the foundation is organized and supervise the management.

As a member of the foundation board, you will take part in meetings six to eight times per year and work with other board members to determine the strategic direction and the future of the pension plan.

- You have sufficient German language skills to follow the foundation board meetings, which are held in German.
- You have good methodological knowledge (e.g. management and strategy knowledge, process knowledge) or basic specialist and industry knowledge, preferably in the field of occupational retirement provision.
